**DISCUSSION:** Robert Henning would like interns to be challenged more so more could get accomplished. He would also like to use grad students instead of undergrads. Lisa Marquiss stated that the RMA will be sponsoring two interns next summer. The plan is to have one in collections and one in education. There was general discussion about the work/study program with Gillette College. Currently there is one position available with collections.

## **F. Museum Program/Exhibit Report**

- I. Visitation Report –There is a printed report in each packet. We served **1,562** guests in July which was down 978 or 38.5% from last July. Most of the decrease is due to not having a big July event like last year's Homestead Heritage Festival, but some is also due to slow regular visitation as well. Generally, this summer tourist season has been slow. We have picked up a few more bus tours due to the mine tour closures, but it hasn't been enough to make up for the decrease in regular visitation. For the year, we are down 304 visitors at a total of **8,970** guests. We should pick back up in August in large part due to the PGI convention where we had over 400 guests in a week.

**DISCUSSION:** Robert Henning said the numbers for PGI week is actually closer to around 550 once the number were updated.

## COLLECTIONS DEPARTMENT UPDATE

9-12-2019

The Collections Assessment and Inventory is in process. The focus currently is the scrapbooks and books. There are currently 84 scrapbooks in the collection and 2634 items with the object name book. Each scrapbook will be boxed either in premade archival boxes or custom archival boxes which are made on site. An assessment of the collection will be written. A one-year project timeline of goals has been created.

### **Deaccession**

There are currently 116 items for deaccession consideration this month. They are primarily books that have little or no provenance. There are a few books that will be maintained as props for staff use in programs and exhibits. There is a parasol that was used in the Grandma's Attic hands on area that has deteriorated beyond repair and the chairs and couch used in the Kintz Room for guests to use.

### **Cataloging**

There are approximately 836 total items remaining in the backlog. December 2018, January 2019, February 2019, and April 2019 are completed. The June 2019 donations are currently being cataloged; there are approximately 15 items remaining that will be completed by September 18th.

The items donated in May 2019 will cataloged next; there are approximately 202 items to catalog for May.

There are approximately 289 items to catalog from June 2018 and approximately 333 items from March 2019.

The current goal is to complete the backlog by March 1, 2020.

### **Gillette College Work Study**

An interview was conducted with a Gillette College student for the collections department work study job posting. The job was offered to the student and we are awaiting a response of acceptance. The goal will be to select an area where the student can assist with the inventory project.

### **Volunteers**

Currently, volunteers are working on scanning the Reece diaries and cataloging props and lithics. They will also be assisting in the deaccessioning process. As the scrapbook and book inventory proceeds, a volunteer to scan the scrapbooks will be sought.
