Goals for grant applications were discussed for 2018.

Goal of 25 participants. There have been 25 since July 1st 16/adult and 9/juvenile.

Goal for screenings, received referral and either held screening meeting or administratively denied, was 15 adult and 10 juvenile. All of 2018 there were 18 adults and 10 juveniles.

Goal for signed up participants, goal was 10 for adults and 5 for juveniles; all of 2018 there were 10 adults and 4 juveniles. Reasons lower for juveniles are: level of care needed, two families not high enough need and the fact juvenile participants are just lower over all.

Coordinators Teleconference Update

The discussion was mainly around the new data system. There will be a gap in the input of data from February, 2019 to May, 2019. There will be in person and web training that is mandatory. You can have as many people as you want trained. The system is supposed to be user friendly.

Other Business

There are a few bills that could affect drug courts. One is removing prosecutors from being part of the group that approve participants. The second is creating a process to pay interest on the fund. It was also brought up they are looking at removing CARF requirements for drug courts.

There is also a new expungement bill where the CA's office could file to have records expunged.
