1% Applications & Presentations Discussion	After the 1% presentations last week, the CARE Board wanted to get together again to go over the recommendations to the Commissioner's for the funding requests of the agencies represented by the CARE Board. The Board reviewed applications, went over the recommendations and justifications to the Commissioner's in preparation for the meeting with the Commissioner's coming in April.
New Business:	
CSBG Funding Letter	Commissioner Bell wanted input on a letter drafted to all agencies receiving CSBG funding in Campbell County. The CARE Board discussed the letter and recommends that the letter needs to be more about the misunderstanding with the article printed in County 17 about the CARE Board and the Council of Community Services; the Council never asked to take on all of the CSBG funding, the CARE Board approached the Council and asked if they'd be interested in entertaining the idea of taking over the CSBG grant, while creating and maintaining positive long-term vendor relationships within Campbell County. The CARE Board would like the agencies to know the Council did not approach the Board, like the article in County 17 led readers to believe.
