Board of Equalization

The Campbell County Board of Commissioners acting as the Board of Equalization met on Thursday, September 6, 2018 to hear tax protests. Chairman Christensen called the meeting to order at 9:05 AM.

Present were, Mark Christensen, Rusty Bell, Clark Kissack, Commissioners; Susan F. Saunders, County Clerk and Carol Seeger, Deputy County Attorney.

Carol Seeger presided as the Hearing Officer.

The Board of Equalization proceeded with Docket No. 2018-0001.

Appearing for the Taxpayer was Joshua Bellin.

Appearing for the Assessor's Office were, Lisa Back; Chief Deputy Assessor; Troy Clements, County Assessor

Ms. Seeger administered the oath to Joshua Bellin, Lisa Back; Chief Deputy Assessor and Troy Clements, County Assessor.

Mr. Bellin provided no additional documents and gave his testimony.

Lisa Back; Chief Deputy Assessor gave her testimony and submitted Exhibits A-1 thru A-13 which were received with no objection.

Lisa Back; Chief Deputy Assessor and Mr. Bellin answered questions that were asked by the Board of Equalization.

Docket No. 2018-0001 was taken under consideration.

The hearing for Docket No. 2018-0001 was adjourned at 9:55 AM.

The Board of Equalization reconvened at 2:00 PM.

Chairman Christensen called the meeting to order.

Carol Seeger presided as the Hearing Officer.

The Board of Equalization proceeded with Docket #2018-0006.

Mr. Scott Fischer, representing Stallion Rockies LTD appeared telephonically.

Appearing for the Assessor's Office was Jim Edwards, ESQ, Troy Clements, County Assessor, Lisa Back Chief Deputy Assessor and Erin Slattery, Appraiser III.

Ms. Seeger administrated the oath to Scott Fischer, Troy Clements, and Erin Slattery.

Mr. Fischer offered exhibits marked A-C.

Mr. Edwards objected to their introduction based upon foundation and relevancy. The objection was sustained, and the exhibits were not admitted or considered by the Board.

The Assessor's Office exhibits A1-A19 were presented and admitted into evidence with no objections being made to their admission.


Mr. Fischer gave his testimony.

At the end of the Taxpayer's case, the Jim Edwards on behalf of the Assessor requested the Board of Equalization make a motion to dismiss for the reason the Taxpayer did not overcome the legal presumption of the correctness of the Assessor's valuation by credible evidence.

The Board granted the request to consider the motion.
