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# Gillette, Wright and Campbell County Optional 1% Sales Tax Survey Results, 2014

## 1. Background

In May of 2014, the Wyoming Survey & Analysis Center (WYSAC) at the University of Wyoming (UW) contracted with the City of Gillette, Town of Wright, and the Campbell County Board of Commissioners (Client) to conduct the 2014 Gillette, Wright and Campbell County One Percent (1%) Optional Sales Tax Survey. The purpose of this survey was to provide the client with data that are statistically reliable and generalizable to the larger population of Campbell County, City of Gillette, and Town of Wright. The survey is used to gauge how the community prioritizes the re-investment of the fund generated by the 1% optional sales tax.

## 2. Methods

### 2.1. Questionnaire Development

The survey content, including introduction and background text, was provided to WYSAC by the Client for review and feedback. In addition, each of the three parties (Gillette, Wright, and Campbell County) provided WYSAC with the final list of projects to be included in their geographic subsection of the questionnaire. WYSAC recommended that each of the projects be prioritized by respondents on a six-point interval scale, where 0=*Do not fund*, 1=*Low*, 3=*Medium*, and 5=*High* priorities. This would allow for multiple types of analysis, including easily ranking projects based on mean score.

### 2.2. Sample Design

A decision was made to use a scientific probability sample of households for the survey. Using scientifically drawn probability samples allows for generalization of the results to the larger population of interest. Not having that possibility was the main drawback of convenience samples used in the past.

Initially conceived to achieve approximately 600 completions, a simple random sample of Campbell County residents would result in a distribution that reflects the actual population distribution in the county. In this scenario we would expect roughly 25 responses from the Town of Wright; too few to make any inferences about that subgroup. As a result, the initial sample was stratified to achieve roughly 60% of completion from the City of Gillette, 20% from the Town of Wright, and 20% from the balance of Campbell County. This stratification allows for a large enough sample in all geographies to make subgroup estimates. When analyzing the results for the county as a whole, weighting of the survey sample was required to accurately reflect the actual population distribution in Campbell County.

The sample was drawn from the USPS delivery sequence file, which includes all mailable addresses in Campbell County (both physical and post office boxes). This frame provides the most complete coverage available, as every household that receives mail has an opportunity to be included in the survey sample.

### 2.3. Survey Administration

In early July a letter was sent to all households in sample informing them of the survey and its purpose. This letter included an invitation to complete the survey on the web and did not inform them that they receive a paper survey if they do not respond online (in order to drive respondents who have access to the internet to the web). After this contact letter, WYSAC followed the remaining steps of the industry standard four-sequence mailing: a paper questionnaire mailing, a reminder letter with web invite, and a replacement questionnaire. Initially conceived to switch to standard/bulk mail after step two to save on postage costs, the design was altered to send all steps via first-class stamped mail due to low initial response rates.

Because of significantly lower response rates than expected, an additional effort was made to secure the target number of completions. Based on the web response rate to the initial contact letter, it was estimated

that an additional one-time web invitation mailing to another randomly drawn 4,900 addresses in Campbell County would secure the target number of completions.

## 2.4. Response Rates


A total of 548 completions were achieved as a result of both mailing efforts, lower than the target of 600. Just over half (52.4%) of the surveys were completed via paper survey, with the remaining 47.6% completed via the web instrument. The initial survey effort consisted of a four-sequence mailing to 2,500 addresses, and resulted in 423 survey completions for a 19.3% response rate (when considering valid addresses). At the time of close of data collection, the additional one-time mailing to 4,900 Campbell County households with an invitation to complete the survey via web resulted in 125 completions, for a 2.8% response rate (when considering valid addresses). The response rate for the second effort was just short of what was expected, based on the web response to the first efforts contact letter. The approximate margin of error for random samples of this size is  $\pm 4.2$  percentage points with 95% confidence.

## 2.5. Data Compilation and Analysis

Once data collection was closed, the data was exported into IBM SPSS Statistics Version 22, where it was cleaned as needed, merged, and prepared for analysis. For county level analysis, survey data was weighted to accurately reflect the population distribution within Campbell County. Using weighted data for the county level analysis is essential in generalizing the findings for the respondents to the survey to the population of interest.

### 3. Key Findings

Before being asked to prioritize the projects for each location, respondents were asked a number of demographic/background questions to be used for data weighting and additional analysis. When asked how long they have lived in Campbell County, 73.7% of respondents said that they have lived there for more than 10 years. During analysis, comparisons were made between those who have lived in the County for 10 years or less and those who have lived there for more than 10 years. Employment status was asked of all respondents, with 65.0% of respondents indicating they were employed *full-time*. The next largest status was *Retired*, consisting of 25% of survey respondents. For analysis, comparisons were made between those who were retired and those who answered any of the other available options. (See Table 2 & Table 3.)




All respondents were asked where in Campbell County they lived, as well as where they work or go to school. Any respondent who lives or works in the City of Gillette was asked to complete the block of Gillette specific questions, and anyone who works or lives in the Town of Wright completed that block of questions. All survey respondents were asked to complete the section of questions relating to Campbell County as a whole. When looking at overall Campbell County results, the data was weighted to accurately reflect the population distribution within the county to account for the oversampling of Wright households.

Of those who work full or part-time or are a full-time student, 58.7% say that they work in the City of Gillette while 6.8% say they work or go to school in the Town of Wright. Just over a third (34.5%) say they work or go to school elsewhere in Campbell County. Almost two-thirds (68.6%) of respondents live in the City of Gillette, 12.0% live in the Town of Wright, and the remaining 19.3% report that they live elsewhere in Campbell County. 

If employed or full time student, where do you work or ...





Finally, 89.9% of respondents reported that they were registered to vote, while 87.7% said that they planned on voting in the 2014 November elections. (See Table 6 & Table 7.)

### 3.1. City of Gillette

All survey respondents who said they live and/or work in the City of Gillette (n =416) were presented with a list of 20 projects and asked to give their opinion on what priority each of the projects should be given. See Figure 1 for a complete visual presentation of projects ranked by mean score.



Nearly half of all respondents (47.3%) said that “upgrade and maintain city streets” was a *high priority* for the City. With a mean score of 4.08, this item ranks as the highest priority for those who live and/or work in the City of Gillette. This item also had the lowest standard deviation in responses for all projects, indicative of a high level of consensus among respondents. This item also had the fewest number of respondents who skipped the item (*seen but not answered* = 5) or had *no opinion* (n=1). (See Figure 1 & Table 8.)


With a mean score of 3.82, “water system improvements” ranked second while “utility system improvements” and “storm drainage improvements” ranked third and fourth with mean scores of 3.49 and 3.38, respectively. For “water system improvements,” 64.6% of respondents rated this as a 4 or 5 - *High* priority, while 53.2% of respondents indicated the same for “utility system improvements.” Finally, 49.5% of respondents said that “storm drainage improvements” was a 4 or 5 - *High* priority for the City. (See Figure 1, Table 10, Table 27, and Table 11.)

These top four rated items all represent improvement projects related to city infrastructure. These four items all had the smallest standard deviation in responses of all 20 projects, indicating a high level of consensus among respondents. There were no statistically significant differences found when comparing sub-groups (**retired vs other; <=10 years vs. >10 years of residency; will vote in election vs no/don't know**).


Of the 20 items presented to those who work or live in the City of Gillette, two additional items could fall under the category of infrastructure improvements: “sidewalk and bike path improvements” ranks 8<sup>th</sup> overall (mean=3.07), while “construct new arterial streets” ranks 14<sup>th</sup> (mean=2.76). (See Figure 1, Table 15 & Table 9.)

The fifth ranked project, “Public Works Services (i.e. Spring Cleanup)” (mean=3.24) was the only project in the top 5 to have a between-subgroup difference, where those who are retired give it a higher priority (mean=3.61) than those who are not retired (mean=3.13). (See Figure 1 & Table 26.)


City of Gillette-Water system improvements

City of Gillette-Storm drainage improvements




After indicating the priority for each of the 20 projects, respondents were given an opportunity to write in which of the projects they felt is the highest priority for the City of Gillette. Open ended responses were back-coded into the appropriate categories to enable calculating the percentage distribution of responses. When looking at this percentage distribution, it's important to keep in mind that not all survey respondents wrote in a response here.

“Which of the above projects should be the highest priority for Gillette?”



**City of Gillette-Gillette Golf Course (Back 9)**




Outside of the top 5 projects, standard deviation of responses increases and we see additional statistically significant between-subgroup differences. The lowest priority project, “Gillette Golf Course (Back 9)” (mean=1.39) had the 4<sup>th</sup> largest standard deviation. The item with the largest standard deviation (indicating low consensus among respondents) was the 17<sup>th</sup> ranked project, “Splash Park/Pool” (mean=2.58). This item showed a significant difference in mean score between those who have lived in the county for 10 years or less (mean=2.89) and those who have lived in the county for 10 years or more (mean=2.47). For the 16<sup>th</sup> ranked project, “Public improvements in the Downtown area & other commercial corridors” (mean=2.63), there was also a significant difference between these subgroups, with those who have lived in the county 10 years or less rating it as a significantly higher priority (mean=3.09) than those who have lived there for more than 10 years (mean=2.47). **City of Gillette-Splash Park/Pool**




**City of Gillette-Public improvements in the Downtown ...**




Other between subgroup differences were found for the middle ranked projects. The 14<sup>th</sup> ranked project, “Construct new arterial streets” (mean=2.76) was a significantly higher priority for those who were employed/other (mean=2.84) compared those who are retired (mean=2.49). For the same subgroups the 8<sup>th</sup> ranked project, “Sidewalk and bike path improvements” (mean=3.07) was a significantly higher priority for those who are employed/other (mean=3.18) than those who are retired (mean=2.72). This project was also a higher priority for those who have lived in the county for 10 years or less (mean=3.44) than for those who have lived there for more than 10 years o (mean=2.95). “Park improvements” (mean=2.90) was a significantly higher priority for those who have lived in the county for 10 years or less (mean=3.26) than those who have lived there for more than 10 years (mean=2.77). 
City of Gillette-Landscaping of Public Right of Ways








### 3.2. Town of Wright


The top priority project of the 12 presented to all respondents who said the live, work, or go to school in the Town of Wright was “Street improvements” with a mean score of 3.82. See Figure 2 for a complete visual presentation of projects ranked by mean score. There were significant sub-group differences for this item, with those who have lived in the county for more than 10 years saying it was a higher priority (mean=4.27) than those who have lived there for 10 years or less (mean=3.15). Those who are retired consider “Street improvements” a higher priority (mean=4.67) than those who are not retired (mean=3.61). (See Figure 2 & Table 33.)

The second ranked priority project by those who live, work, or go to school in the Town of Wright was “Economic development programs and incentives” (mean=3.33), followed by “Storm drainage improvements” (mean=3.02), and “Capital replacement reserve” (mean=2.94). (See Figure 2, Table 28, Table 37 & Table 39.)


**Town of Wright-Street improvements**

**Town of Wright-Storm drainage improvements**




The lowest rated priority project for the Town of Wright was “Southern Campbell County Airport” (mean=1.17), with almost half of respondents (47.6%) responding *Do Not Fund*. This project also had the only other statistically significant between-subgroup difference, with those who have lived in the county for 10 years or less rating it as a significant higher priority (mean=1.96) compared to those who have lived there more than 10 years (mean=0.66). (See Figure 2 & Table 30.) The other four lowest ranked priority projects by those who live, work, or go to school in the Town of Wright are “Riding and roping facility” (mean=1.70), “Museum extension” (mean=1.91) and “Chad road extension” (mean=2.32). (See Figure 2, Table 35, Table 38 & Table 36.)


“Which of the above projects should be the highest priority for the town of Wright?” (Write in)



### 3.3. Campbell County

All survey respondents were asked to rate the priority each of 13 projects should be given when thinking of Campbell County as a whole. Like the other sections all projects were examined for statistically significant between-subgroup differences. Projects were examined for statistically significant differences between those who live in either Wright or Gillette, compared to those who live elsewhere in the County. Of the 548 survey respondents, 442 (80.7%) live in Gillette or Wright, while 106 (19.3%) live elsewhere in the County. See Figure 3 for a complete visual presentation of projects ranked by mean score. In Figure 3, the white bar indicates the county as a whole (weighted data, reflect the actual population distribution). The green bar indicates those who live in Gillette/Wright, while the blue bar indicates those who live in the County outside of Gillette and Wright.




The highest rated project for Campbell County was “County pavement management and road maintenance” (mean=3.86). This project had the lowest standard deviation in responses, indicating the highest level on consensus among respondents. Respondents who live elsewhere in the county rated this project as a higher priority (mean=4.03) than did those who live in Gillette or Wright (mean=3.78), although the difference was not statistically significant. (See Figure 3 & Table 43.)

Of all projects presented, only one project was found to have a statistically significant difference between those who live elsewhere in the county compared to those who live in Gillette or Wright: the 4<sup>th</sup> highest priority project “Youth programs and equipment” (mean=3.31) is significantly a higher priority for those who live in Gillette or Wright (mean=3.39) than those who live elsewhere in the county (mean=3.07). (See Figure 3 & Table 52.)


The second highest priority for Campbell County residents was “Senior citizen programs” (mean=3.54), while the third highest ranked project was “Upgrade emergency and safety equipment, including catastrophic fire suppression” (mean=3.39). (See Figure 3, Table 49 & Table 51.)

As previously mentioned, the 4<sup>th</sup> ranked project was “Youth programs and equipment” (mean=3.21). The 5<sup>th</sup> ranked project for Campbell County was “Solid waste operations” (mean=3.30), which also has the second lowest standard deviation for this section indicating a higher level of consensus among respondents. 
**Campbell County-Senior citizen programs**




**Campbell County-Upgrade emergency and safety ...**



**Campbell County-Youth programs and equipment**




**Campbell County-Solid Waste operations**




Of all 13 Campbell County projects, the lowest rated project was “Human Service providers contracts for service” (mean=2.60). The next lowest mean score was “District support grants” (mean=2.63), followed by “District grant program service” (mean=2.65). (See Figure 3, Table 47, Table 45 & Table 44.)

As previously mentioned, the highest rated projects for Campbell County also tended to have the lowest standard deviation in responses indicating higher consensus among respondents. The three middle ranked projects, “Contributions to capital replacement reserve” (mean=2.90), “Gillette college” (mean=2.94), and “Substance abuse prevention, education, and treatment” (mean=3.05) had the highest standard deviations for this section. The high standard deviations indicate a wide spectrum of opinions on these three projects for Campbell County residents, and can be visually observed in the accompanying tables displaying percentage distributions for each of the items. 


### Campbell County - Project Priorities (Means)









## 4. Complete Survey Results

The raw frequency counts and percentage distributions of responses to all items included in the survey are presented below. Questions are presented with the wording and in the order used in the survey.

### CITY OF GILLETTE, TOWN OF WRIGHT, CAMPBELL COUNTY 2014 OPTIONAL 1% SALES TAX SURVEY

Since 1976, the 1% Optional Sales Tax has been in effect, and the funds generated by this optional sales tax have remained in Campbell County for community projects. All dollars generated are re-invested into the communities and the county, and are extended through the use of matching state and federal funds.

The 1% Optional Sales Tax is a means for our citizens to have a direct investment and support the needs of our communities and county. The identified projects are meant to develop infrastructure, improve services and continue to enhance the quality of our communities. The 1% Optional Sales Tax applies only to items that are subject to sales and use tax. It DOES NOT apply to rental payments, home acquisitions or gasoline purchases. It is estimated that as much as 20 percent of the revenues generated from the 1% Optional Sales Tax are paid by visitors and tourists.

With this survey we are asking for your input on the use of the 1% Optional Sales Tax funds. Your opinions are very important to us in making fund allocation decisions. Your participation in the survey is voluntary and you will not lose any of the benefits you are otherwise entitled to if you choose not to participate.
