

I will use appropriate language when interacting with league and game officials, players, spectators and treat them with respect. I will be drug and alcohol free at all team games.

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Campbell County Parks & Recreation MENS/WOMENS Softball Home Rules

- 1. A game may begin or finish with 8 players, if and when another player arrives, that player can be inserted into the lineup at the ninth (9th) or tenth (10th) batting position. If a team starts with 9, 10 or 11 players and losses a player(s) they will take an automatic out for each player(s) lost. If a team starts with 8 players and then lose a player during the game, the game will be forfeited by that team at that point. A team may use an EP, but is not required to do so. If a team starts with 11 players, all 11 must bat and any 10 may play defense. Defensive positions may be changed, but, the batting order must remain the same.
 - ❖ Bat Tester: All bats will be scanned through the bat tester to make sure they comply with the ASA standards for bats. Due to players altering bats (shaving & rolling of bats) we are scanning all bats that are used in our city league program. Once your bat has been scanned a sticker will be placed on your bat and then it will be legal to play with in our program. If your bat does not have a CCPR sticker on it, it will be considered an illegal bat.
 - We will give each team a 2-week window to get all bats scanned and stickered (MAY 27, 2019 Bats must have CCPR Sticker).
 - Bats will be scanned out at the fields.
- 2. Batter-Runner is out if, when using the double base, and there is a play on the batter-runner, the batter-runner touches only the white portion and the defense appeals prior to the batter-runner returning to first base. NOTE: This is treated the same as missing the base.
- 3. No steel or metal cleats are allowed.
- 4. We will follow the ASA Non-Approved Bat list for bats that will be banned in our league.
- 5. Sliding will be permitted. However, if a player's sole purpose in sliding is to take the person out, Player will be called out and ejected from the game and be required to sit out the next game.
- 6. The red stitch 12" ball with a COR of .52 shall be used for men's play.
 - The red stitch 11" ball with a COR of .44 shall be used for women's play.

(CCPR will supply all game balls.)

7. At scheduled game time a team must have at least 8 legal players (4 men & 4 women for coed teams) on the field ready to play and properly registered. If a team doesn't have enough at game time:

The game clock will start and the umpire will allow that team up to 10 minutes to get 8 legal players before the forfeit is declared. The waiting time is counted as playing time. In the event the previous game runs over this is considered part of your 10-minute waiting period.

The team that is waiting for their 8th player will automatically be the visiting team; there will be no coin toss by the official. If both teams are waiting for their 8th player, the official will do the coin toss.

- 8. Regulation game time is fifty-five minutes, 7 innings or Run Rule. In the event of a tie at the end of regulation, only one (1) inning should be played to break the tie.
- 9. Run Rule:
 - 3 or more completed innings 20 run advantage
 - 4 or more completed innings 15 run advantage
 - 5 or more completed innings 10 run advantage

(Teams that are winning by this number of runs after the 3rd, 4th or 5th inning the game will be called and that team will be declared the winner)

- 10. If both teams do not show up for their game, both teams will be marked with a forfeit loss.
- 11. Pitchers are allowed 5 pitches at the start of the game and 1 pitch between innings.
- Batter will start with a 1-1 count when they step up to bat.
 (NO COURTESY FOUL)
- 13. A Strike Mat will be used in Men's C, D & E as well as the Women's Leagues.
- 14. Pitching: Ball must reach a height of at least 6 ft from the ground and not exceed the max height of 10 ft. from the ground. Umpire discretion.
- 15. Home Run Limit for each league as follows:

- A & B League: 6 home runs per team per game:
- *Any home run exceeding this will result in an out.
- C and below & Women's League: 4 home runs per team per game:
- *Any home run exceeding this will result in an out.
- 16. When a batter hits a HR, the batter and all runners are credited with a run, the batter and runners are not required to run the bases. Team that hits a home must chase after the ball.
- 17. There will be NO infield practice before games.
- 18. FOUL LANGUAGE:

Any player who uses foul language directed toward another player on the field or umpire will cost their team 1 out when their team is batting or when they come up to bat. The official who hears the player using the foul language will notify the team captain who is at fault prior to the team batting. Any player who uses foul language a second time will be removed from the game.

- 19. AT NO TIME SHALL A PLAYER BE ON MORE THAN 1 MENS or WOMENS TEAM DURING THE SEASON. If a player is found to be playing on two teams that player will not be allowed to play for their actual team for two games and the team that they played illegally for will forfeit the game they did play in.
- 20. All teams are required to have uniforms by the week of May 27-30. MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS: Uniforms must be at least shirts of the similar color and numbered.
 - * After the week of May 27-30 teams that do not have the minimum requirements for uniforms will take an out for each player their first time at bat in the game. Any team that has met the requirement, but have players show up out of uniform, those players will take an out their first time at bat but allowed to play.
- 21. Stealing will be allowed in A & B League. Runners may advance when the ball reaches home plate, or if the pitcher has the ball and is not in the vicinity of the pitching plate (the umpire will decide whether the pitcher was or was not with in the vicinity of the pitching plate).
 - 1) If a runner stops or is clearly not advancing when the catcher releases the ball to the pitcher (who is in the vicinity of the pitching plate) and the pitcher catches the ball, the play is ruled dead and all runner(s) are returned to the last base legally touched.
 - 2) If the pitcher does not catch the ball or have possession of the ball while in the vicinity of the pitching plate, the ball remains live and the runner(s) may advance.
 - 3) Runners may not advance if the pitched ball hits the batter, the ground before reaching the front edge of home plate, or home plate. The ball is dead and a ball is awarded to the batter.
 - 4) The pitcher may cover any base on an attempted put out and if a play is being made on a runner off the base, the ball remains live.
 - 5) The above will apply for both legal and illegal pitches.
 - 6) A pitched ball that hits behind home plate and strikes the umpire, or a thrown ball by the catcher that hits the umpire, remains live and runners may advance.
- 22. All Players must be on team rosters to be eligible to play. Result of not on roster will be forfeiture for that game. Teams may add players through the season and up till the team's first tournament game. No more additions will be allowed after first game of the tournament.
- 23. PROTEST RULE: A. <u>Illegal Player:</u> Must be made while the player in question is in the game and before the umpires leave the playing field.
 - B. Rule Interpretation must be made:
 - 1. Before the next pitch
 - 2. Before the next play
 - 3. Before all infielders have left fair territory
 - 4. On the last play of the game, before the umpires leave live ball territory
 - * PROTESTS MAY ONLY INVOLVE THE INTERPRETATION OF A RULE.
- 24. No unnecessary roughness permitted! *REFER TO PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT*
- 25. NO SMOKING OR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ALLOWED IN THE SOFTBALL COMPLEX.

IF A PLAYER IS CAUGHT WITH AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE INSIDE THE SOFTBALL COMPLEX WHILE HIS OR HER TEAM IS PLAYING, THAT PLAYER WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PLAY AND IF THE TEAM HE/SHE IS ON DOESN'T HAVE ENOUGH TO FIELD A TEAM THE GAME WILL BE A FORFEIT AT THE POINT OF BEING CAUGHT.

- 26. Music will only be allowed to be played during warm up prior to the 6:30 games. No music in the dugouts during the game.
- 27. Courtesy Runner: One Courtesy Runner per team per inning will be allowed. Use them wisely!
- NOTE: All games will be played in accordance with the 2019 Amateur Softball Association (ASA) official rules, unless otherwise specified.
