CAMPBELL COUNTY ROCKPILE MUSEUM IS A 2021 BLUE STAR MUSEUM

Rockpile Museum to offer free admission to military personnel and their families.

Gillette, Wyoming – May 6, 2021 – The Campbell County Rockpile Museum announced it will join museums nationwide in the Blue Star Museums initiative, a program that provides free admission to currently-serving U.S. military personnel and their families this summer. The 2021 program will begin on Armed Forces Day, Saturday, May 15, 2021, and end on Labor Day, Monday, September 6, 2021. Find the list of participating museums at arts.gov/bluestarmuseums.

Blue Star Museums is an initiative of the National Endowment for the Arts in collaboration with Blue Star Families, the Department of Defense, and participating museums nationwide.

“The Rockpile Museum has always been a big supporter of our servicemen and women, and we are pleased to participate in the Blue Star Museums program again this year,” said Museum Director Robert Henning. “As we transition to admission fees this summer, we want everyone to know that all currently-serving U.S. military personnel and all veterans of the U.S. armed forces will receive free admission into the Rockpile Museum all year round.”

Blue Star Museums include children’s museums, art, science, and history museums, zoos, gardens, lighthouses, and more, and hail from all 50 states, as well as the District

of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The current list of participating museums will continue to develop over the summer as organizations are welcome to register to be a Blue Star Museum throughout the summer.

The free admission program is available for those currently-serving in the United States Military—Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard as well as members of the Reserves, National Guard, U.S. Public Health Commissioned Corps, NOAA Commissioned Corps, and up to five family members. Qualified members must show a Geneva Convention common access card (CAC), DD Form 1173 ID card (dependent ID), or a DD Form 1173-1 ID card for entrance into a participating Blue Star Museum.
