CCPLS Logo and Tag Line History

Campbell County Public Library System's (CCPLS) circle logo was chosen by a committee of CCPLS staff members in 2002 to represent your libraries in Gillette and Wright. 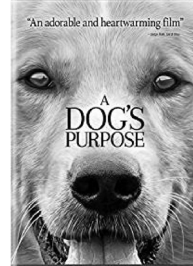


So You Want to Retire

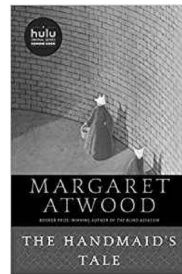

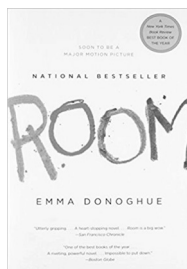
