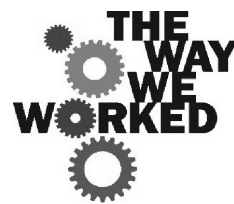

## Coal Mining: Past, Present, and Future presented by Jerry Tystad

Campbell County Public Library (CCPL) is pleased to welcome Jerry Tystad, local retired coal executive, on Thursday, June 7 at 7pm. Tystad will discuss the industry that propelled the Powder River Basin into national prominence. Learn about the history of coal mining in this region and changes that have occurred over the decades.

This program is in conjunction with *The Way We Worked*, a Smithsonian traveling exhibit on display at the Campbell County Rockpile Museum through July 15. Coal is a large part of "the way we worked" and work in Campbell County; Tystad's presentation will reveal some little-known history about our area.

Tystad has a long history in the coal industry. Prior to retirement, he served as Vice President of Continuous Improvement, Asset Management, and Applied Technology for Peabody Energy with responsibilities across US operations. He previously held the position of Vice President of Technical Services for Rio Tinto Energy (Kennebec Energy). He also served as General Manager for the Cordero Rojo and Antelope mines in the Powder River Basin. He has a BS Degree in Mining Engineering from South Dakota School of Mines.

*The Way We Worked* explores how work became a central element in American culture by tracing changes that affected the workforce and work environments over the past 150 years. It is created by the National Archives and is part of Museum on Main Street, a collaboration between the Smithsonian Institution and Wyoming Humanities. 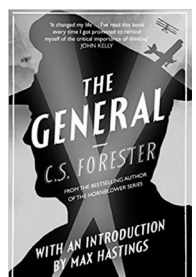
**The General** by C.S. Forester
