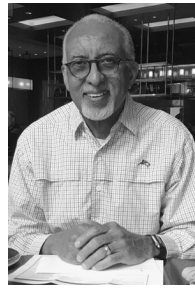
## The Black 14 as Told by John Griffin

Campbell County Public Library is pleased to welcome John Griffin to speak on Sunday, September 9 at 2pm. Mr. Griffin is a former Wyoming Cowboy and a member of the Black 14.

"The incident that came to be known as "The Black 14" began on October 17, 1969 when 14 African-American players were dismissed from the University of Wyoming football team by then coach Lloyd Eaton. These players wanted to wear black armbands during the game with Brigham Young University the next day to protest a policy of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints that they considered to be racist. BYU is operated by the LDS Church and the policy in question was one that would not permit African Americans to become priests." In Griffin's words "I was 21 years old on that fateful day. I was a kid who was transformed into a man. We respectfully wanted to discuss a form of protest with Coach Eaton. The notion of us protesting or refusing to play never happened. The incident forced the University and the State into a dialogue with 14 African-American student athletes, who were summarily dismissed from the football team. It forced the University to grapple with the notion of racial inequality and their First Amendment Rights; these are still being discussed today. Instantly, my position in life was not to let the incident define me, or let it diminish my goal of graduating from the University of Wyoming. I eventually earned a degree in Education. It's been my life's mission to reunite with the members, and through lectures and personal interactions dispel the myths, while promoting the truth."

Mike has always been involved with literature. He wrote his first novel in elementary school—*Captain Poopy's Sewer Adventures*. He's been writing more or less non-stop ever since, but fortunately for his readers, *Ashfall*, a story set in the aftermath of the eruption of the Yellowstone supervolcano, was his first published novel. The book received numerous awards and he has gone on to write four additional books, the latest titled *Surface Tension*.

Mike holds a black belt in Songahm Taekwondo. He lives in Indianapolis with his wife and her three cats. He is represented by Kate Testerman of kt literary.

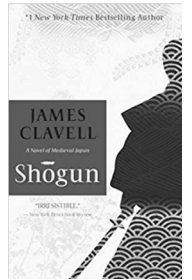
